



Medicaid, Medicare, Social Security, and SSI are Lifelines for Hawaii Residents with Disabilities

Lifelines for Hawaiians with Disabilities...

Medicaid, Medicare, Social Security, and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) are lifelines for Hawaiians with disabilities, including people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) and their families:

Medicaid

- Hawaii's Medicaid program enrolls over 284,000 people including over 28,000 non-elderly adults and children with disabilities.¹
- Over 2,500 Hawaiians with I/DD receive Medicaid home and community-based (HCBS) services.²

Medicare

 Medicare enrolls over 222,000 Hawaiians, including over 26,000 people with disabilities.³

Social Security

 Social Security serves over 240,000 Hawaiians, including over 26,000 Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) beneficiaries, along with their spouses and dependent children.⁴

SSI

 SSI serves over 25,000 low-income seniors and people with disabilities in Hawaii.⁴

...that Boost the Hawaii Economy

Medicaid and Medicare bring federal dollars into Hawaii and help create jobs:

- Medicaid brought the state of Hawaii over \$748.4 million in federal dollars in 2012.⁵
- Medicare spending in Hawaii was over \$1.5 billion in 2009.⁶

Social Security and SSI benefits are typically spent in-state and help boost the Hawaii economy:

- Social Security paid over \$3.2 billion in benefits to Hawaiians in 2013, including over \$370 million in Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) benefits.⁴
- SSI paid over \$160 million in federal benefits to Hawaiians in 2013.⁴
