

Medicaid, Medicare, Social Security, and SSI are Lifelines for New Jersey Residents with Disabilities

Lifelines for New Jerseyans with Disabilities...

Medicaid, Medicare, Social Security, and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) are lifelines for New Jerseyans with disabilities, including people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) and their families:

- Medicaid**
 - New Jersey's Medicaid program enrolls over 1,055,000 people including over 176,000 non-elderly adults and children with disabilities.¹
 - Over 11,200 New Jerseyans with I/DD receive Medicaid home and community-based (HCBS) services.²
- Medicare**
 - Medicare enrolls over 1,408,000 New Jerseyans, including over 214,000 people with disabilities.³
- Social Security**
 - Social Security serves over 1,525,000 New Jerseyans, including over 229,000 Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) beneficiaries, along with their spouses and dependent children.⁴
- SSI**
 - SSI serves over 177,000 low-income seniors and people with disabilities in New Jersey.⁴

...that Boost the New Jersey Economy

Medicaid and Medicare bring federal dollars into New Jersey and help create jobs:

- Medicaid brought the state of New Jersey over \$5.2 billion in federal dollars in 2012.⁵
- Medicare spending in New Jersey was over \$15.5 billion in 2009.⁶

Social Security and SSI benefits are typically spent in-state and help boost the New Jersey economy:

- Social Security paid over \$23.2 billion in benefits to New Jerseyans in 2013, including over \$3.4 billion in Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) benefits.⁴
- SSI paid over \$1.0 billion in federal benefits to New Jerseyans in 2013.⁴
