



Medicaid, Medicare, Social Security, and SSI are Lifelines for Utah Residents with Disabilities

Lifelines for Utahns with Disabilities...

Medicaid, Medicare, Social Security, and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) are lifelines for Utahns with disabilities, including people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) and their families:

Medicaid

- Utah's Medicaid program enrolls over 349,000 people including over 41,000 non-elderly adults and children with disabilities.¹
- Over 4,300 Utahns with I/DD receive Medicaid home and community-based (HCBS) services.²

Medicare

 Medicare enrolls over 307,000 Utahns, including over 49,000 people with disabilities.³

Social Security

 Social Security serves over 346,000 Utahns, including over 53,000 Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) beneficiaries, along with their spouses and dependent children.⁴

SSI

 SSI serves over 30,000 low-income seniors and people with disabilities in Utah.⁴

...that Boost the Utah Economy

Medicaid and Medicare bring federal dollars into Utah and help create jobs:

- Medicaid brought the state of Utah over \$1.3 billion in federal dollars in 2012.
- Medicare spending in Utah was over \$2.2 billion in 2009.⁶

Social Security and SSI benefits are typically spent in-state and help boost the Utah economy:

- Social Security paid over \$4.7 billion in benefits to Utahns in 2013, including over \$720 million in Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) benefits.⁴
- SSI paid over \$180 million in federal benefits to Utahns in 2013.⁴
