



Planning Ahead for Hill Visits

- Make appointments with delegation before you go
- Look at Committee assignments to determine priorities
- Senate HELP, Finance, Budget and Appropriations, Foreign Affairs
- House Education & Workforce, Energy & Commerce, Ways and Means, Budget, Appropriations
 - May coordinate with others in your state



Tips for Planning Hill Visits

- Plan ahead who will say what? Tie personal story with policy objective
- Be on time, polite, respectful, honest
- Use Talking points; leave Fact Sheets
- Take a camera
- Don't be offended if meeting with staffer
- Lobbying vs. educating
- Follow up with thank you letter & additional info, if

needed
