



Medicaid, Medicare, Social Security, and SSI are Lifelines for Idaho Residents with Disabilities

Lifelines for Idahoans with Disabilities...

Medicaid, Medicare, Social Security, and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) are lifelines for Idahoans with disabilities, including people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) and their families:

Medicaid	•	Idaho's Medicaid program enrolls over 271,000 people including over 43,000 non-elderly adults and children with disabilities. ¹ Over 2,600 Idahoans with I/DD receive Medicaid home and community-based (HCBS) services. ²
Medicare	•	Medicare enrolls over 248,000 Idahoans, including over 44,000 people with disabilities. ³
Social Security	•	Social Security serves over 288,000 Idahoans, including over 47,000 Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) beneficiaries, along with their spouses and dependent children. ⁴
SSI	•	SSI serves over 29,000 low-income seniors and people with disabilities in Idaho. $^{\rm 4}$

...that Boost the Idaho Economy

Medicaid and Medicare bring federal dollars into Idaho and help create jobs:

- Medicaid brought the state of Idaho over \$1.0 billion in federal dollars in 2012.⁵
- Medicare spending in Idaho was over \$1.7 billion in 2009.6

Social Security and SSI benefits are typically spent in-state and help boost the Idaho economy:

- Social Security paid over \$3.8 billion in benefits to Idahoans in 2013, including over \$630 million in Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) benefits.⁴
- SSI paid over \$170 million in federal benefits to Idahoans in 2013.⁴
