



Medicaid, Medicare, Social Security, and SSI are Lifelines for Louisiana Residents with Disabilities

Lifelines for Louisianans with Disabilities...

Medicaid, Medicare, Social Security, and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) are lifelines for Louisianans with disabilities, including people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) and their families:

Medicaid

- Louisiana's Medicaid program enrolls over 1,285,000 people including over 237,000 non-elderly adults and children with disabilities. 1
- Over 9,900 Louisianans with I/DD receive Medicaid home and community-based (HCBS) services.²

Medicare

Medicare enrolls over 730,000 Louisianans, including over 173,000 people with disabilities.³

Social Security

 Social Security serves over 826,000 Louisianans, including over 182,000 Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) beneficiaries, along with their spouses and dependent children.⁴

SSI

 SSI serves over 180,000 low-income seniors and people with disabilities in Louisiana.⁴

...that Boost the Louisiana Economy

Medicaid and Medicare bring federal dollars into Louisiana and help create jobs:

- Medicaid brought the state of Louisiana over \$5.0 billion in federal dollars in 2012.
- Medicare spending in Louisiana was over \$7.8 billion in 2009.⁶

Social Security and SSI benefits are typically spent in-state and help boost the Louisiana economy:

- Social Security paid over \$10.5 billion in benefits to Louisianans in 2013, including over \$2.3 billion in Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) benefits.⁴
- SSI paid over \$1.0 billion in federal benefits to Louisianans in 2013.⁴
