



Medicaid, Medicare, Social Security, and SSI are Lifelines for Texas Residents with Disabilities

Lifelines for Texans with Disabilities...

Medicaid, Medicare, Social Security, and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) are lifelines for Texans with disabilities, including people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) and their families:

Medicaid

- Texas's Medicaid program enrolls over 4,844,000 people including over 636,000 non-elderly adults and children with disabilities. 1
- Over 29,100 Texans with I/DD receive Medicaid home and community-based (HCBS) services.²

Medicare

 Medicare enrolls over 3,261,000 Texans, including over 598,000 people with disabilities.³

Social Security

 Social Security serves over 3,657,000 Texans, including over 644,000 Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) beneficiaries, along with their spouses and dependent children.⁴

SSI

 SSI serves over 656,000 low-income seniors and people with disabilities in Texas.⁴

...that Boost the Texas Economy

Medicaid and Medicare bring federal dollars into Texas and help create jobs:

- Medicaid brought the state of Texas over \$16.5 billion in federal dollars in 2012.
- Medicare spending in Texas was over \$33.2 billion in 2009.⁶

Social Security and SSI benefits are typically spent in-state and help boost the Texas economy:

- Social Security paid over \$48.3 billion in benefits to Texans in 2013, including over \$8.7 billion in Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) benefits.⁴
- SSI paid over \$3.7 billion in federal benefits to Texans in 2013.⁴
