



Medicaid, Medicare, Social Security, and SSI are Lifelines for Wyoming Residents with Disabilities

Lifelines for Wyomingites with Disabilities...

Medicaid, Medicare, Social Security, and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) are lifelines for Wyomingites with disabilities, including people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) and their families:

Medicaid

- Wyoming's Medicaid program enrolls over 89,000 people including over 11,000 non-elderly adults and children with disabilities. 1
- Over 2,100 Wyomingites with I/DD receive Medicaid home and community-based (HCBS) services.²

Medicare

Medicare enrolls over 86,000 Wyomingites, including over 13,000 people with disabilities.³

Social Security

 Social Security serves over 96,000 Wyomingites, including over 14,000 Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) beneficiaries, along with their spouses and dependent children.⁴

SSI

 SSI serves over 6,000 low-income seniors and people with disabilities in Wyoming.⁴

...that Boost the Wyoming Economy

Medicaid and Medicare bring federal dollars into Wyoming and help create jobs:

- Medicaid brought the state of Wyoming over \$268.8 million in federal dollars in 2012.
- Medicare spending in Wyoming was over \$630 million in 2009.⁶

Social Security and SSI benefits are typically spent in-state and help boost the Wyoming economy:

- Social Security paid over \$1.3 billion in benefits to Wyomingites in 2013, including over \$190 million in Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) benefits.⁴
- SSI paid over \$30 million in federal benefits to Wyomingites in 2013.⁴
