Why This Matters to The Arc

- Receive numerous inquiries from selfadvocates, parents, law enforcement, attorneys, etc. who want to do the right thing but lack tools and resources
- No nationally unified, connected group of advocates or self-advocates taking this issue on at the level it needs
- We believe no one agency or profession can tackle this issue alone

New to The Arc?

- Founded in 1950, nation's leading and largest community-based organization
- Network of 140,000 members in almost 700 state and local chapters serving more than 1.4 million people with I/DD* and their families
- National headquarters in Washington, DC with strong federal-level public policy advocacy and program services department (over \$10 million awarded funds)
- Provide "birth to grave" services and advocacy in areas such as: prevention, early intervention, special education, health care, employment and criminal justice

^{*} Intellectual disability is a disability characterized by significant limitations in both intellectual functioning and in adaptive behavior, which covers many everyday social and practical skills. This disability originates before the age of 18.

- Florida mom turned attorney planted the seed for LE training in 1970's
- The Arc worked with IACP to develop a 4 page "training key"
- The Arc develops full curriculum in 1998 for chapter network

About NCCJD

- Two year BJA grant for \$400,000
 (Oct 2013 Sept 2015)
- First national effort of it's kind to bring together victim and offender/suspect issues
- Serve as a national clearinghouse for information and training on the topic of people with I/DD in the criminal justice system

NCCJD Mission

To pursue and promote safety, fairness and criminal justice for people with disabilities as suspects, offenders or victims of crime, becoming the national focal point for resources on the subject and serving as a bridge between the worlds of criminal justice and disability.

NCCJD Primary Goal

To build the capacity of the criminal justice system to respond to gaps in existing services for people with disabilities, focusing on people with I/DD.*

*While legislation/courtrooms/legal documents may still use the outdated term "mental retardation" or "retardation," the disability community uses the term "intellectual and/or developmental disabilities" or "I/DD"





Goal of NCCJD Training Program:

Increase Awareness and Understanding







Challenges in the Criminal Justice System

As Suspects or Offenders:

- Not want their disability to be noticed
- Not understand their rights, but pretend to
- Say what they think others want to hear
- Be the last to leave scene of the crime, first to get caught
- Have little options for alternative sentencing and/or treatment

As Victims

- Easily victimized and targeted for victimization
- Less likely to be able to report
- Easily influenced by and eager to please others
- Think that perpetrator is a "friend"
- Not be considered a credible witness

NCCJD Certificate of Training Program

- 1. Create core components of training program via NAC and focus group input
- 2. Provide NCCJD certification to chapters of The Arc and other disability agencies (5 on-site trainings, including pilot-testing)
- 3. Chapters/disability agencies provide training to MDTs* (law enforcement, victim advocacy agencies, legal professionals) via this evidence-based model

^{*} MDTs – multidisciplinary teams

NCCJD: Activities to Date

- I&R/TA requests for approximately 50 callers.
- Statewide conference in CO The Arc of Aurora
- TA provided for MD statewide commission.
- Amicus briefs related to death penalty
- First phase of web site complete
- Developing webinar series, white paper topic list and draft of training program
- Feb meetings with Dept. of State & IACP
- Responded to several reporters (including ATF story)

Recent Activities: In the News

- News articles alleging ATF was inappropriately using individuals with I/DD in sting operations led to intervention by NCCJD
 - Botched ATF sting in Milwaukee ensnares braindamaged man
 - Documents, interviews show agents employed tactics similar to those used in Milwaukee
- NCCJD's intervention:
 - The Arc wrote letter to U.S. Attorney General asking ATF to end tactics and thoroughly investigate allegations that people with disabilities were exploited in sting operations
 - ATF officials opens the door to new training

Recent Activities: In the News

- State of MD responds to tragic death of Robert Ethan Saylor by forming commission* to address the need for statewide law enforcement training
- NCCJD's involvement:
 - Provides technical assistance for internal sub-committee
 - Issues joint press release with The Arc of MD
 - Participating in listening sessions hosted by Commission

^{*} Maryland's Commission for Effective Community Inclusion of Individuals with I/DD

Recent Activities: In the News

- US Supreme Court case Hall vs. Florida
 - How states apply the definition of "mental retardation" or ID
 - Sentenced to death for killing 21 year old pregnant woman in 1978
 - Expert evaluations documented Hall's disability
 - Case centers on if states can establish hardline ceiling on IQ (Hall's measured at 70)
 - The Arc recently joined Amicus Curiae brief and believes states should not be allowed to create a stricter or more limited definition of ID than the professionally accepted clinical definition

NCCJD Next steps...

- Launch the website in early February
- Conduct 3 focus groups with target populations
- Post reviewed fact sheets on Criminal Justice and Disability to the website
- Begin building database for model legislation
- •Spread the word about February and March webinars
